This follows a hectic but hugely enjoyable Christmas project. Thanks to the generosity of our donors we were able to distribute over 11,000 fantastic new toys and gifts. Thanks to all concerned for contributing and for making the festive period such a special time for all our families.

We continue to appeal for books (both new and used) for our Books Forever project. This area of our work is increasing as more schools throughout Manchester and Salford request our Book Roadshows. This together with our Book Clubs, means that children's books are always in high demand!

With the addition of our Childhood Experiences, this promises to be another busy and challenging year as we aim to improve the life chances of local children living in poverty. IN MEMORY

In January we said goodbye to a very special lady. Delayne, a former Manager and staunch longstanding supporter of Wood Street, sadly passed away, shortly before what would have been her 80th birthday.

Delayne joined us in 1961, helping out in the office with book-keeping duties, "I'll just come for a month until you get somebody else" she told the Trustees at the time. Some 27 years later she was still here, "Because you know, Wood Street just gets to you."

In 1962 she became part of a Management team with Arnold Yates, with the two of them going on to transform Wood Street, so that it was more suited to the demands of a rapidly changing world.

Delayne oversaw the closure of the Wood Street holiday camp at Squires Gate, whilst then opening an outward bound centre in the Peak District. During this period a youth club was opening in Wood Street, which was attended by up to 230 children each week!

In 1988, after 27 years loyal and dedicated service Delayne decided to retire. But her involvement continued as a donor, supporting our projects.

Early last year we began the process of updating our archives, Delayne being an obvious candidate to approach, to see if she would be willing to share her memories of her long career. Delayne as ever couldn't have been more helpful and was delighted to assist. Her vast knowledge and attention to detail meant that we were able to capture and record a vital and influential period of our history.

We send our sincere condolences to Delayne's Husband Paul, her family and friends.

A LOOK BACK TO 2019

There are 75,480 children living in poverty in Manchester and Salford. That's enough children to fill Old Trafford. A sobering thought isn't it?

In 2019 our Family Basics project helped 3,784 children with clothing, bedding, toiletries, nappies, and baby equipment. We helped 3,191 children with brand new school uniform. 273 children enjoyed our Book Clubs and in the academic year 2018/19 our Book Roadshows in schools provided 929 children with 9,500 books!

All of this support makes a tangible difference to the lives of local children. The clothing and essentials bring the obvious benefits but the books bring escapism, creativity, a sense of pride and literacy skills that will help the children progress in education and ultimately help them to break the cycle of poverty.

With your continued support we will continue to provide for those who need our help and a chance to break that cycle. After all, we've been doing it for over 150 years, we can and still do, make a difference.

POVERTY TRUTH

14 million people are living in poverty in the UK with 4 million of those being children.

Certain pockets of the UK are in dire need of change and the latest report by the Joseph Rowntree Foundation highlights the growing problem of inwork poverty.

UK Poverty 2019/20 is the Joseph Rowntree Foundation's annual report on poverty levels in the UK.

Nationally, approximately 56% of people living in poverty are from a working family.

7 in 10 children living in poverty are from a working family. When we look at the families who were referred to us in 2019, just over a third of them are in work yet still need our support.

Poverty restricts the opportunities available to people and limits their access to things that most of us take for granted.

Simply nipping somewhere on the bus can cost the equivalent of a meal and tough choices need to be made. Families can't deal with unexpected expenses like the washing machine breaking down and can find themselves falling into a spiralling debt. Debt being the second biggest reason for referral to us.

We are working closely with the various partners in our region to tackle the issues we face on our doorstep but we face incredibly challenging times.

BOOKS FOREVER APPEAL

We are looking for brand new books that will be distributed throughout the year via our Family Basics project, Book Clubs and Roadshows.

The deadline for donating books to our Appeal is 3rd April and you can find all of the details on the back cover of this Newsletter.

Books can be dropped off with us Monday to Friday from 8.30-4.30. Books play a vital role in our work. They allow children some escapism, the ability to dream, the obvious benefit of deepening their knowledge and of course, vital literacy skills. Education is key to ending the cycle of poverty and with your help and the power of books, we can achieve so much.

COMMUNITY BOOK SHELVES

In 2019 our community book shelves increased to 14 and there are now regular deliveries of books to a whole variety of places throughout Manchester and Salford giving children regular access to books.

They are invited to take one book a week, recorded by the centre in which the 'shelf' is based. They can keep the book at home or return it should they choose to do so. Most children keep the books! In 2019 we distributed 5970 books to our Community Book Shelves.



BOOK CLUBS

Families on a low income can struggle to afford to buy books for their children. Our school holiday Book Clubs aim to inspire a love of reading, encourage families to read together and improve literacy. Thanks to your valuable support, children can choose from a wide range and take home a big bag of their very own books from the thousands we take to every event.

143 families and 272 children attended the Book Clubs in 2019

The CLINK restaurant provide healthy packed lunches for the children which we collect fresh on the day and the children have a very busy few hours. With school holidays proving to be an expensive time of year for our families, these free events are always well attended.



BOOK ROADSHOWS

During 2018 we were concerned that we weren't reaching those children who were in the greatest need of books and literacy support.

Following two incredibly successful school visits, our Books Forever Roadshows were born! During the academic year 18-19, 929 children and young people encountered our Roadshows and approximately 9500 books were distributed. In late 2019 we had an incredible day over at Lower Kersal Community Primary School in Salford. The children loved our Book Roadshow and they all got to take home 7 books each in their special red bags.

We were delighted that Yvette Fielding and her husband Karl Beattie also joined us on the day. Yvette read from her new book 'Archie the Ghost Hunter' and the children all got to take a copy home.



SMARTSTART

Our SmartStart project helps families meet some of the costs of going to school. During the Summer, families can order new non-branded school uniform items that their children need, in time for going back to school in September.

Many families have to cut back on day to day basics or get into debt to be able to afford uniform and other kit for school. SmartStart aims to help alleviate some of the pressure placed on families at such an expensive time of year.

It's essential that all children feel equal, arrive at school warm and dry but most of all we want to enable children from low income families to fit in and achieve at school. A good education is key to being able to break the cycle of poverty.

We are very aware that children grow like they've been planted in 'grow bags' so for the rest of the year, we aim to provide new and good quality used donations. These items are all accessible through our Family Basics project which is open all year round (except for Christmas).

We are always looking for donations of:

- Non-branded (no school logo) school uniform items including jumpers, sweatshirts, cardigans, skirts, pinafores, trousers, polo shirts, shirts, blouses, in all standard school colours and age ranges
- Sports kit such as shorts, t-shirts, hoodies, joggers, fleeces, trainers and plimsolls
- Stationery such as pencil cases, pens, folders, maths sets, calculators and dictionaries
- Dressing up costumes suitable for school events like World Book Day
- Useful everyday items like new socks, new underwear, hats, gloves, lunchboxes, school bags and sports bags.

You can help by

- Donating used and new school uniform and other school items.
- Hold a collection for items at your work, church or school.
- You can also choose to make a financial donation. We rely on donations to provide this and other services to families.

In 2019 our SmartStart project helped 3,191 children with school uniform and back to school essentials.
